The Musée des beaux-arts de Sherbrooke (MBAS) is offering a bold educational experience conceived to enrich each pupil's individual culture and critical mind.

The specific programs, ranging from pre-school to post-secondary, are made up of a guided tour and a creative workshop, enabling participants to explore the various facets of the exhibitions presented at the MBAS. With its expertise in museum education and cultural outreach, our outreach team will adapt your visit to the realities of your group.

PRESCHOOL AND ELEMENTARY 1ST CYCLE

Storytelling: *The Art Book of Spells*

Comfortably settled in the family space, the children let themselves be carried away by the enchanting story of *The Art Book of Spells*, each page of which is a work from the educational collection of the MBAS. A workshop using watercolour sticks rounds out the story.

A Starry Visit

The children are guided through the current temporary exhibition. At a pace suited to small children's state of wonder of, the group will discover the artworks while learning how to visit a museum. They will then make an artwork in the educational studio by trying their hand at the tissue paper bleeding colour technique.

ELEMENTARY (2ND AND 3RD CYCLES) SECONDARY (ALL CYCLES)

Visit and creative workshop

28 september 2023 – 7 january 2024

The group will take part in a guided tour of the exposition of the work of the artist Skawennati, *Teiakanahstahsontéhrra' We Extend the Rafter*, which presents a machinima animated film, made in virtual reality. A playful game prompts thinking about our relations with the linearity of time.

An exploratory visit to the exhibition *Forgotten! Scott, Brandtner, Eveleigh, Webber: Revisiting Abstraction in Montreal in the 1940s* is being offered. A creative workshop to make an abstract work with ink, watercolours, gouache and feathers on vellum paper completes this activity.

8 February – 21 April 2024

The group will take part in a guided tour of the immersive exhibition *Jérémie St-Pierre: A Magnificent Desolation*, which presents a body of works which interrogate the emotional potential of memory. To complement their visit, the students will take part in a creative workshop exploring image transfer techniques with photographic archives using medium fluid matt.

An exploratory visit to the youth exhibition *In My Head* will follow. A visit at once strange, introspective, sensitive and colourful will guide the students as they think about their own subjectivity and their emotions, tastes and aesthetic preferences.

16 May – 8 September 2024

The group will take part in a guided tour of the exhibition *Retrospective: Doucet-Saito*, which pays tribute to the work of two major sculptors in Estrie (Ways Mills). To complement the visit, a creative workshop in clay sculpture will explore in greater depth the theme of zen and harmony from the perspective of collaboration.

An exploratory visit to the *Contemporary Native Art Biennial (BCA)* will introduce students to an abundant body of work by Indigenous and Inuit artists around a common theme.

SECONDARY (ONLY)

Outdoor Ramble: Parcours Photo Sherbrooke

Beginning 14 September 2023

Accompanied by a guide, students will explore the outdoor Parcours Photo Sherbrooke exhibition 2023-24, entitled *Cross Residences: Artists in the Collections*, which brings together the work of Karine Dezaïnde, René Bolduc and Geneviève Marois-Lefebvre.

A 1.4 km ramble takes participants to three photography stations around the magnificent Lac-des-Nations. This exhibition highlights the abundant collections of the **Musée de la nature et des sciences de Sherbrooke**, the **Musée d'histoire de Sherbrooke** and the **Musée des beaux-arts de Sherbrooke**.

Suitable clothing and footwear are required. The departure point for this outdoor visit is the first station of Parcours Photo Sherbrooke, near the intersection of King and Belvédère streets.

In the company of a guide, the group will visit all of our exhibitions (temporary and permanent). Conversations between the guide and the participants are encouraged as a way of creating bonds between people, according to their interests and respecting their different levels. The MBAS endeavours to establish connections with its audiences based on inclusion. This visit will be adequately adapted to the goals and realities of the group (such as participants' language, their mobility, any disability, etc.). The visit may be rounded out with a creative workshop which varies according to the exhibitions on display.
